IN THE NEWS

As discussed in the August Spasticity Summit Scoop, AAPM&R responded to five Medicare Administrative Contractors (MACs) releasing draft local coverage determinations (LCDs) which would significantly restrict coverage for botulinum toxin injections for spasticity and other conditions. This month, two MACs that did not release draft LCDs earlier this year, Novitas and First Coast Service Options, have now released their draft LCDs on botulinum toxin. AAPM&R is working alongside member experts in spasticity management to draft responses to the draft LCDs by the November 23rd deadline. We encourage members who treat patients in the First Coast or Novitas jurisdiction to submit comment as well.

READING OF THE MONTH

Dr. Kimberly Heckert, an accomplished physiatrist at Thomas Jefferson University and Academy member, was the lead author of a recent article published in Molecular Diversity Preservation International (MDPI) titled "Delphi Analysis: Optimizing Anatomy Teaching and Ultrasound Training for Botulinum Neurotoxin Type A Injection in Spasticity and Dystonia." The article establishes a consensus on best practices for anatomy education and ultrasound-guided botulinum neurotoxin type A (BoNT-A) injection training for specialists treating spasticity and dystonia. The article identifies a variety of key areas that can assist in the development of effective training programs in these fields.
